

Medicine Absolutely Must Change Course

We are currently on a collision course in medicine, and my objective is to bring about a renaissance in medicine. We have turned a blind eye, and chose to ignore obvious corruption within our healthcare system, for too long. With profit as the primary objective, promoted and manipulated by the most profitable industry in the world, medicine has basically become dysfunctional. The most effective therapies are often ignored, if the profit potential is inadequate, or could potentially replace a current therapy, proven more profitable, even if it's less effective.

For over half a century, we have continued to practice toxic medicine, such as radiation and chemotherapy, as the primary cancer therapy. Destroying the immune system, and creating anemia, would be a perfect way to establish a cancer-friendly environment, to encourage future cancer development. The terrible side effects from the therapy are normally worse than the cancer itself. A great deal of the horror associated with cancer is the threat of dealing with the typical symptoms such as nausea, terrible fatigue, and loss of hair.

Natural practitioners, dating back over half a century, soon learned that if you discovered a natural cure for cancer (which many had), you had better not advertise the fact – something Harry Hoxsey, N.D. learned the hard way. In the book *When Healing Becomes A Crime* (2001), Kenny Ausubel did an excellent job of exposing and documenting the corruption of medicine, which unfortunately still exists today. He focuses mainly on Dr. Hoxsey, who was able to cure tens of thousands of patients with Stage Four cancer (those whose doctors had basically given up on them), with an herbal formula that his father, a veterinarian, used to successfully cure horses of cancer.

Fortunately for animals, healing is not a crime in their regard. Thus, they get much better care than we as humans do. It is also far more cost effective, otherwise meat would be cost prohibitive for all except the wealthiest. Veterinarian medicine is based on nutrition and prevention, (as should ours). Although animals can get the very same diseases as man, they seldom do. According to Dr. Joel Wallach, D.V.M., N.D., cures for 900 different diseases in animals have already been found, yet we are still plagued with the very same diseases, in spite of our tremendous healthcare budget.

Animals can also get high blood pressure, yet the veterinarians don't give them beta blockers, ACE inhibitors, or calcium channel blockers. Why is that true? Because, it is obviously not cost effective, as well as not really necessary. The truth is – that not only applies to animals, but also humans.
